George R. "Smitty" Smith & Eva Thompson

Some may remember the heart wrenching unsolved homicides of George R. "Smitty" Smith and Eva Thompson. CAH featured their story (written by Granddaughter, JoAnn Holland) in our June 2003 Newsletter. I will recap a few excerpts in JoAnn's words:

"On Veteran's Day, November 11, 1991, our lives changed forever. On that quiet afternoon, my dear 80-year-old grandmother, Eva Thompson and my wonderful 67-year-old stepfather, George "Smitty" Smith were brutally murdered in their home. My mother, Ann, and Smitty owned a well-known lunch/dinner restaurant in Prunedale, CA near Salinas and Monterey. The restaurant building also functioned as home for all three family members. The restaurant was closed on Veteran's Day, so my mother went out to do some shopping. While my mother was out, a murderer cut the screen in the back door and entered their home/restaurant. Smitty was sitting at his desk...my grandmother confined to her hospital bed in her room. The murderer approached Smitty from behind and slashed his throat; then went to my grandmother's bedroom and slashed her throat as she fought for her life. The primary suspect knew the layout of the building and the motive was robbery. —continued on page 5 Our Next Meeting will be on Sunday, November 10th 10:00 a.m.

Gavin Newsom, Governor,

l am earnestly requesting that you overturn the August 15, 2024, Parole Board decision to grant a parole date to convicted murderer Reginald Glover. On April 25, 1991, Glover senselessly and brutally shot LaSonia Quinetta Graham (age 25) in the back of the head during a robbery attempt, killing her instantly. He was sentenced to 25 years-to-life.

LaSonia was an only child. She was caring, fun-loving, outgoing and brightened the lives of everyone who knew her. She had so many wonderful plans for the future. Heaven only knows all she could have accomplished in her lifetime.



Reginald Glover must be held accountable for his personal choice to execute an innocent young woman and must accept the consequences of his actions. LaSonia had so much to offer this world and she will never get the opportunity; she is gone forever. Therefore, Reginald Glover does not deserve a second chance or the privilege of freedom.

Please deny parole to convicted murderer Reginald Glover for the maximum time allowed by State of California law.

UPDATE-

CHARGES BROUGHT IN 1991 COLD CASE MURDERS FOR STABBINGS AT SMITH'S RESTAURANT IN PRUNEDALE

Monterey County District Attorney Jeannine M. Pacioni announced on July 16, 2024, that Ira Ulyesses Bastian, age 85 and a current resident of Fresno, has been charged with the coldcase murders of 67-year-old George Smith and his 79-year-old mother-in-law, Eva Thompson.

In 1991, Mr. Smith and his wife Anna owned and lived at Smith's Restaurant, which was located on El Camino Real in Prunedale. Victim Mrs. Thompson was Anna Smith's mother who lived with the couple.

On November 11, 1991, Anna Smith returned home from running errands and discovered that her husband and mother had been brutally stabbed to death. Mrs. Thompson, who was unable to walk, was found slain in her hospital-style bed.

Bastian, then age 52, was a former employee of Smith's Restaurant. He was considered a suspect in the initial investigation, though no arrests were made at the time. The Monterey County Sheriff's Office diligently pursued the case for decades and continued to submit and re-submit items of evidence in the case for newer and more sophisticated DNA testing. In 2024, an additional round of DNA testing yielded sufficient evidence to support the arrest and filing of criminal charges. Bastian was arrested without incident on July 15.

Bastian is charged with two counts of first-degree murder, with special circumstance allegations that he murdered the victims during the commission of a burglary and that he committed multiple murders. It is also alleged that he personally used a knife in the commission of the killings. If one or more of the special circumstances is found true by a jury, Bastian could potentially face the death penalty or life in prison without the possibility of parole.

In July 2020, District Attorney Jeannine M. Pacioni created the Monterey County District Attorney's Office Cold Case Task Force, which represents the largest and most comprehensive county-wide effort to investigate, solve and prosecute cold-case homicides in Monterey County. Since the creation of the Cold Case Task Force, many cases have been solved. Funding from a U.S. Department of Justice grant enabled the Cold Case Task Force to seek justice in this case.

Anyone who has information about Ira Bastian or the murders of George Smith and Eva Thompson is encouraged to contact District Attorney Investigator Oliver Minnig.

Note: We are familiar of the quote "Justice delayed is justice denied." Today, after almost 33 years, we can now appreciate justice for George and Eva. —Shellie Cervantes
